ABOUT

The AIGA Philadelphia Scholarship Fund is an annual scholarship program in the amount of \$2,500 to support local design students by awarding financial assistance to pursue their education. High School, Undergraduate and Graduate students are all eligible to apply. The recipient is chosen on the merits of their application and demonstration of need.

ELIGIBILITY

The scholarship is awarded to students who are currently enrolled in or accepted to college at the time of submission, and who intend to pursue a career in the field of Graphic Design. Applicants must either reside in or attend an accredited College in the greater Philadelphia region.

REQUIREMENTS

- 1) Students must be enrolled full time in an undergraduate/graduate program for the 2019/2020 academic year. High School, Undergraduate and Graduate students are all eligible to apply.
- 2) Students should major in or intend to major in a Graphic Design or related program (Visual Communication, Interactive Design, etc.)
- 3) Students must have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC Score), of less than \$15,000. This number is on your FAFSA form, to see what it looks like click [here](http://achieveatlanta.org/wordpress/wp-content/uploads/2016/09/Sample-SAR.pdf).
- 4) Students must have a minimum GPA Requirements of 2.0.

Applicants must provide the following materials in an 8.5x11 document saved in PDF format labeled with your last name, first name. Applications should be emailed to: gmcgee@philadelphia.aiga.org by April 19, 2019 with the title AIGA Scholarship Fund in the subject line.

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT

Official high school or university transcript, including current GPA. Please include this with the PDF application.

page 3:

ESSAY

Write a 500 word essay incorporating the following:

1. A brief autobiography.
2. In the future, how do you see yourself as a creator contributing to the community at large?

page 4:

EFC SCORE

Scholarships are only awarded to students who are in financial need; applicants must, therefore, provide a FAFSA EFC score. Please provide the full page of your actual FAFSA showing the EFC Score.

EXAMPLES OF YOUR WORK

Provide 5 examples of your best work with a brief description of the project. If you would like to submit movies, motion graphics, or interactive files for your portfolio you must submit electronically by including active links (for example; YouTube and Vimeo).

Tips for presenting your work:

Remember that your work will be viewed on a computer screen. • Images should be an original digital file when possible. Otherwise, make sure photographs or scans or work are properly lit and in focus. •

Feature your work as simply and as clearly as possible; single images read much better than multiples on one page.
